

Attached please find a survey map and written metes and bounds of the street property to be acquired from the City of Greenville for the sum of \$1.00 and associated fees.





### White Residence Hall Renovation Phase 3

### **BACKGROUND:**

Residential services plans for routine renovation of the student dormitory facilities over time across the campus. Clement, Greene and White residence halls are also being renovated in 2016, 2017 and 2018 for modernization as well as to bring them into compliance with the 2012 North Carolina Building Code.

Modernization of these three buildings has occurred incrementally to accommodate schedule and budgetary constraints. White Residence Hall has undergone two phases of renovations for each of the last two summers.

As investigative work on each of these dormitories has been conducted over time it has been determined that the exterior brick walls of White, Greene and Clement Residence Halls are constructed of solid masonry veneer with a solid block backup with no air gap, insulation nor wall flashings. Although a common practice in years past, this construction methodology is no longer in use.

These exterior walls adsorb significant rainwater during storms and develop significant interior wall damage as a result. This requires constant repairs and is a source of student dissatisfaction. Additionally, the lack of proper wall insulation, flashings and air gap in the walls results in higher energy costs for cooling and heating.

As such, part of the renovation of White Residence Hall will be to reconstruct the exterior building skin of the building.

While the functionality and code compliance of the façade is being addressed, it is prudent to simultaneously improve the overall façade aesthetics. Such changes in look of the building are significant from a Campus Planning perspective and must be accomplished with the context and requirements of the ECU Master Plan and this precinct of campus.

As such, the project team has developed the attached exterior building image to review with the Board of Trustees. It is being presented for information and discussion at this time.

### **EBOLA PREPAREDNESS OVERVIEW**

### **Finance & Facilities Committee**

### November 20, 2014

Currently, there are about 14,000 Ebola cases and 5000 deaths mostly occurring in West Africa. There may be more than 100,000 cases by January. So far, cases in Senegal, Nigeria, Spain and the U.S. have been successfully contained. Liberia, Guinea and Sierra Leone are the countries of concern due to limited infrastructure and cultural practices and are currently under CDC travel warnings. There have been limited cases in the U.S. and the spread of the disease has been due to direct contact with bodily fluids. The girlfriend and family of Mr. Duncan (Dallas patient) were removed from quarantine with no symptoms and they had close contact so this is a good sign. Ebola is not spread through the air and therefore not easily spread like the flu. Ebola is a deadly disease, but can be overcome with quick detection and treatment. We must prepare, but not panic.

ECU initiated communication with its UNC safety counterparts on August 6<sup>th</sup>. The ECU Communicable Disease Outbreak Planning Team started meeting on August 11<sup>th</sup> to review potential impacts to campus, update plans and procedures, and review ECU Physicians and Student Health Services preparedness and needs. The team includes infectious disease experts and representatives from Employee Health, Student Health Services, Biosafety, Environmental Health & Safety, Human Resources, International Affairs, Continuing Studies, Academic Affairs, Vidant Health, Pitt County Health Department and Pitt County Emergency Management. ECU has also discussed and reviewed Ebola plans with the ACC EH&S Directors, UNC EH&S Directors and Emergency Management Coordinators, and NC DHHS. ECU has been involved in regular conference calls with other UNC schools, UNC-GA and NC DHHS.

In general, the plan is to screen clinic patients through a questionnaire, isolate suspect Ebola patients in a designated exam room if symptoms and travel/exposure history meet CDC criteria and then contact the Pitt County Health Department. The Pitt County Health Department will contact Greenville Fire Rescue (emergency medical services) to transport the patient to Vidant. The PC Health Department will also contact Vidant to prepare for the arrival of the suspect Ebola patient. Vidant will isolate and treat with the possibility of transfer to a more specialized facility like Emory University Hospital, Duke University Hospital or the National Institutes of Health facility.

### **Completed to Date:**

- EH&S initiated discussions with UNC system counterparts on August 6th and met with ECU Communicable Disease Outbreak Planning Team on August 11, 2014
  - This is the same team used during avian/H1N1 flu and SARS
- ECU and Carolina are leading UNC system planning w/Brent Herron (UNC-GA)
- Modifying pandemic influenza plan to communicable disease outbreak plan with specific sections on flu and Ebola.
- Completed inventory of available equipment and ordered necessary supplies.
- Inventoried travelers and identified 4 students from Nigeria and contacted in early August, prior to class start. The students were already past the 21 day incubation period with no symptoms when contacted. Other students could not return due to travel restrictions. Ghana is the only Study Abroad site in West Africa and has had no applicants for past few years. No applications will be approved until Ebola outbreak is resolved.
- The Communicable Disease Outbreak Planning Team is coordinating with state/local public health, emergency management, Vidant and UNC system colleagues.
  - Dr. Barry (Director of Prospective Health) is the incident leader with Jolene Jernigan (Director of Student Health Services). The AVC for Environmental Health and Campus

Safety is chairing the team with the emergency coordinator – monitoring the outbreak, staying current with CDC and other guidelines and sharing information

- PH/SHS lead units; EH&S support and planning role working together
- Met with UNC system, ACC EH&S directors and having regular conference calls with NC DHHS and UNC schools to plan, monitor, and share best practices, policies and procedures.
- Met with Staff Senate fielded question about mission trip with church
- Sent memo to Deans and VCs early on to provide awareness of efforts and CDC travel warnings
- Sent memo to campus on October 23rd regarding travel procedures for following CDC travel warnings – prohibit nonessential travel, procedure for approving essential travel (see attached).
   Personal travel is discouraged and request self-reporting to PH (staff/faculty) and SHS (students)
  - Encouraging students from affected areas to stay in Greenville over holiday. They can contact Housing for assistance.
  - Modifying online travel system to assist in approval and tracking process.
- Security Studies held an Ebola panel discussion at ECU spotlighted global issues and disease
- A second Ebola panel was held on November 17<sup>th</sup> to discuss campus and community response.
- Developed websites on ECU Alert, SHS and Prospective Health An "Ebola: the facts, not the hype" blog post was shared by SHS to clarify truths about the virus.
- The Anthropology Student Organization and the ECU Chapter of Project Tumara hosted an Ebola Awareness Week. Events included an informational booth on Oct. 7 and a bake sale benefitting relief in Sierra Leone on Oct. 8.
- Conducted interviews with WNCT and Public Radio East the week of October 27.

### **Next Steps:**

- Reaching out to students, staff and faculty from West Africa prior to break discourage travel or develop safety plans if essential or personal travel.
- Ongoing monitoring of CDC/DHHS info and collaboration with EHS/PH/SHS and UNC-GA
- Finalize procedures and equipment needs specific to patient intake, isolation and transport to Vidant, decontamination and waste management (pre-treat?). Using Division of Public Health Department's Ebola Evaluation Algorithm provides guidance in this area <a href="http://epi.publichealth.nc.gov/cd/docs/NCDPHEbolaRiskAlgorithm.pdf">http://epi.publichealth.nc.gov/cd/docs/NCDPHEbolaRiskAlgorithm.pdf</a>
- Develop clinic, exam room and contaminated area decontamination response plan using EHS/PH or contractor
- Training of clinical staff is being conducted with exercises and drills to follow.
- Developing travel registry by modifying existing ECU Travel System.
- Ramping up communication reviewing websites, working with Communications and Marketing with targeted communication to campus
- Developing plan for quarantine of students, faculty and staff residence halls, paid leave.
- Planning for academic and other operational impacts continuity of instruction and operations plans

Subject: Important: Ebola Outbreak - Travel Procedures

East Carolina University is closely monitoring Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) information on the Ebola outbreak in West Africa. Currently, the CDC and other health experts state that this outbreak does not pose a significant threat in the United States. The ECU Communicable Disease Outbreak Planning Committee has been meeting since early August and has been preparing for any impact to our campus and community. An Ebola fact sheet and additional information can be found at <a href="http://www.ecu.edu/cs-ecu/alert/University-Response-to-Concerns-of-Ebola-Outbreak.cfm">http://www.ecu.edu/cs-ecu/alert/University-Response-to-Concerns-of-Ebola-Outbreak.cfm</a>.

The CDC issued warnings to avoid nonessential travel toGuinea, Liberia, and Sierra Leone. With the shared goal of protecting the ECU campus and community, the University is following the CDC's recommendations by prohibiting university sponsored travel to the countries under the CDC Travel Warning, unless the travel is reviewed and determined to be essential. Typical academic and research activities would be considered nonessential, while humanitarian efforts may be considered essential.

The University will not support any university sponsored travel to or through these three countries, regardless of funding source, unless reviewed and approved by our infectious disease experts in consultation with the Provost and the appropriate vice chancellor. We encourage you to continue your scholarly work and service in West Africa through electronic means such as videoconferencing or by delaying travel to these countries until the CDC travel warnings and institutional travel restrictions are lifted. If you feel your travel is essential and involves extraordinary circumstances, you can contact Dr. Paul Barry, Director of Prospective Health, by calling 744-2070 or emailing at <a href="mailto:barryp@ecu.edu">barryp@ecu.edu</a>. Dr. Barry and our infectious disease experts will review your proposal and make a recommendation to the Provost and the appropriate vice chancellor. You will need to provide your travel itinerary and emergency contacts, a brief overview of the project, sponsoring agency with contact information, as well as an infection control and contingency plan to insure your safety and the safety of our community upon your return. Travel to these countries must involve contingency plans in case the traveler is quarantined, becomes ill or is restricted from leaving the country.

It is important that the University maintains contact with all ECU students, faculty, and staff who may have traveled or plan to travel to West Africa for work, research, or leisure. We are encouraging those individuals to self-identify and contact the personnel below so we can help you develop a plan to keep yourself, your family and our community safe. Upon returning to the U.S. from a country included in the CDC travel warning, monitor your health for <a href="signs and symptoms">signs and symptoms</a> of Ebola for 21 days and immediately contact your health provider and the appropriate department below if you have a fever and potential exposure to Ebola.
