Athletics and Advancement February 15, 2024 Minutes

The Athletics and Advancement Committee met in regular session on February 15, 2024. A quorum of the committee was established, and the committee approved the minutes from the November 20, 2023 committee meeting.

Director of Athletics, Jon Gilbert, provided the committee with updates on athletics metrics. The numbers are climbing and in the green, largely due to football season tickets going on sale on February 5th. YTD, \$3.6M in season ticket sales compared to \$2M at this same time last year. 3,600 tickets were sold in the first week of 2024 sales, compared to 700 last year. The goal is to sell 15,000 season tickets for the 2024 season. On Pirate Club Pledge Day, \$2.5M was raised in comparison to less than \$1M. The full football schedule with dates and opponents will be announced soon.

The student-athletes are performing extremely well in the classroom finishing the fall 2023 semester with an average 3.25 GPA. That is the highest GPA for a fall semester on record. 70% of student-athletes have a 3.0 or higher GPA.

Baseball season kicks off tomorrow. New LED lights are being installed starting next week. They will be similar to the lights added to Minges last year. An LED advertising screen was added behind home plate which should bring in additional game sponsorship revenue.

On March 11th, sports wagering becomes legal in NC. Athletics is utilizing a monitoring system, US Integrity to monitor activity.

The spring football game will be held on Saturday, April 13th. A large crowd is expected in Greenville that weekend due to baseball hosting UNC Charlotte. Work continues on Name, Image & Likeness (NIL) opportunities for our student-athletes.

Mr. Gilbert asked the committee to approve the Athletics non-salary compensation plan. Cassie Burt motioned. Van Isley seconded. Motion passed.

Current student-athlete and communications major, D'Anta Johnson greeted the committee and shared some of his story. He said that ECU just felt like home from his first visit. He thanked the group for their support as he came from a very small town in Virginia. D'Anta hopes to play in the NFL and pursue a career in sports broadcasting.

The committee then heard from Vice Chancellor for University Advancement, Christopher Dyba, who provided an advancement update, including a review of operational metrics and fundraising updates. The calendar year 2024 is off to a good start. East Campus brought in

\$4.6M in December to close out the year and the Pursue Gold Campaign. West Campus brought in \$1.3M in January to start the year. With the integration with ECU Health, we will start reporting all fundraising numbers for both sides of campus in this post-campaign environment. The Pursue Gold Campaign concluded on December 31, 2023. The comprehensive total finished at \$526.9M, well past the goal of \$500M. Totals by Foundation include \$248.9M to ECU Foundation; \$162.4M to Athletics; \$114M to ECU Health Foundation; and \$1.6M to Alumni. Respective percentages by Foundation include 47.23% to ECU Foundation, 30.81% to Athletics, 21.65% to ECU Health Foundation, and .3% to Alumni. During the campaign, over 200,000 individual transactions were recorded from over 30,000 unique donors which went on to support 2,250 individual funds. 575 new scholarships were created and the total funding for scholarships was \$184M. The scholarship gift type percentages were 34% merit-based; 24% need-based; and 42% other going to specific areas of study. Total funding for endowments, not including money towards supplemental funds, totaled \$209.3M. Since FY 2017, the foundations have provided support totaling \$161M to the University averaging \$23M per year. That number is expected to increase as the endowment grows.

The committee then moved into closed session to consider three naming proposals. The committee approved all naming proposals in closed session.

The committee adjourned at 2:59 p.m.

Steve Kearney, PharmD-Global Medical Director

Steve Kearney is the Global Medical Director at SAS where he helps lead the organization's focus on the future of digital health and innovation in Health Care and Life Sciences. SAS' worldrenowned teams help solve the most complex healthcare challenges utilizing advanced analytical solutions, machine learning and artificial intelligence. An innovator in health outcomes and digital medicine, Dr. Kearney co-developed and implemented one of the first electronic disease registries at Duke Health where he practiced in both inpatient cardiology and outpatient internal medicine during his joint faculty appointment at Duke and UNC. He also served as the Assistant Director of the Non-Affilaited AHEC (Duke) and course Director of Ambulatory Medicine at UNC. Dr. Kearney then joined the Medical Outcomes group at Pfizer where he continued his practical actionable approach to data and the patient journey. He focused on health outcome insights from electronic medical record migrations, early personal digital assistants, novel health software programs and the first large patient claims databases. He was a founding member of Pfizer's Practice Transformation taskforce and served as the Medical Lead of the ACO resource team while also working with national thought leaders on health policy for state and federal agencies. During that time, he served on the NC Governor's Task for Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention, The Behavioral Health Subcommittee for NC Medicaid and the NC Institute of Medicine APCD Taskforce. Most recently he served on the NC Chronic Pain Advisory Board and led the Pfizer effort as part of a partnership with Community Care of North Carolina and Project Lazarus on analytic initiatives and development of a national pain management curriculum for providers. He has a Bachelor of Science degree from East Carolina University and a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from Campbell University School of Pharmacy. He completed a one-year postdoctoral residency in pharmacy practice at Moses H. Cone Memorial Hospital and then joined the pharmacy department at Duke University Medical Center in 1995 where he worked as the clinical pharmacist for family medicine and cardiology. Prior to his Pharmacy degree, Dr. Kearney developed and co-lead a Behavioral Health program for a regional hospital which included development of the curriculum, writing the policies and procedures, designing and overseeing the construction of the facility, working with County and State officials on policy and leading the Capital funds campaign for the facility. Dr. Kearney has received numerous national awards for health care quality and for excellence in teaching. He currently serves on the Board of Directors for The Governors Institute, is a past board member for the North Carolina Association of Pharmacists (NCAP), was co-founder of the NCAP Residency Leadership Conference where he was recognized for 20 years of service in 2019, and was a founding Board Member and past President of the Campbell University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences Alumni Association. He has completed post-doctoral studies at both UNC Kenan-Flagler Business School and Harvard School of Public Health. He is the author of the "Prescription Drug Abuse" Chapter in "A Practical Guide to Analytics for Governments: Using Big Data for Good".

He also introduced this discussion on <u>Addiction in America</u> for the Washington Post.

He has been asked to testify on numerous occasions for the Senate HELP Committee, The House Finance Committee, state and federal agencies and has advised Ministries of Health globally.

Dr. Kearney was appointed in June 2022 to the Office of National Drug Control Policy, Executive Office of the President- Evolving and Emerging Threats Committee.

He along with SAS are founding members of the Coalition for Health AI (CHAI) and Dr. Kearney serves on the Steeering Committee for the organization.

Bert Ward Resume Summary

Robert (Bert) Ward Jr., is a native of Alamance County. Since the mid-1990s, Bert has been actively involved in the purchase, sale, renovation and management of residential properties, and has worked for some of the Triangle's and Triad's top-ranked real estate companies Coldwell Banker - Howard Perry & Walston (HPW), Coldwell Banker – Triad REALTORS® (CBTR), and Keller Williams Realty – Burlington Market Center.

After helping lead Walter Williams High School to the State AAA Football Championship as quarterback and team co-captain under Coach Sam Story in 1985, Bert briefly left Alamance County to earn a bachelor's of science degree from East Carolina University. It was there that he met his wife Mary Staton, who he's been married to since 1991.

Upon graduation, Bert came back to Alamance County to work in credit and collections for Unifi, Inc., an international textile company. From there, Bert obtained his real estate sales license in the summer of 1996, and went to work for Coldwell Banker – Alamance Realty in Burlington. After working there for just a few months, Bert left to pursue a better job opportunity with Better Homes & Gardens – Howard, Perry & Walston (HPW), as a new construction on-site sales agent at Mill Creek Golf Club in Mebane, representing nationally recognized custom home builders C. Richard Dobson (now part of D.R. Horton America's Builder) and John Wieland Homes.

By 1998, Bert had acquired a couple of rental properties, moved on from Mill Creek to obtain his broker's license, and went to work for Dan Mohr Real Estate Schools, one of the oldest and largest private real estate schools in North Carolina. While employed there as the office manager, he completed the residential appraisal courses and in 2000, began appraising for LandAmerica OneStop (formerly Primis Appraisals, and last known as eAppraiseIT), a leading national title insurance company and real estate appraisal/property information service provider.





Public institutions that lost 10 percent of their enrollment between 2019 and 2020 generally had the most trouble recovering the following year, largely because of the struggles of community colleges.



Big Drops in Enrollment Hit Colleges in the First Fall of the Pandemic. Who Was Able to Bounce Back?


URE 3 A SMALLER PIPELINE OF HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES

The 5 "Buckets" of ECU's Student Success Ecosystem







Goals

- **A Well Funded Centralized Scholarship Fund**: For immediate use in the current recruitment cycle plus an endowed component to enable sustainability

Goals

- Fundraise for current use funds of \$2,500 to \$3,000 per student per year: For immediate use in the current recruitment cycle plus
- Build endowment related to these funds: an endowed component to enable sustainability
- **Expand Access Scholars:** set an aggressive goal to double the program over the next few years. (\$5,000 each year for 4 years)






